(Fr. Michael's Reflections)

Tapping into Christ Healing Presence

What God does is create. He makes, enriches and offers healing love that makes life worth living. In today's Gospel, while assenting to go heal Jairus' daughter, Jesus shows his desire to bring fullness of life. While on his way to Jairus' house, He encounters the woman suffering with haemorrhages who desperately reaches out to touch Jesus' cloak, she has a single-hearted desire to be healed. Her weakness meets Jesus' power, and in that meeting, a transformation occurs. In this encounter Jesus does not only heal but draws her into a new life and a new identity, as a beloved daughter of his Father. This is to be the pattern for us as individuals and as a Church as well: Heal the world by a new name of mercy and grace, make it a better place by extending Christ's life-saving presence.

The Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World sets this joy and hope filled vision of her role in the modern world: "The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the men of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ" (GS,1). The celebration of the sacrament of confirmation in our parish this weekend by Bishop Ralph Heskett, C.Ss. R, highlights this mission. The church therefore, must remain an oasis of the healing presence of God's life for all.

The Echo Arena in Liverpool - which can accommodate 10,000 pilgrims - will be the home to a six-hour stage programme on the second day of the Congress, which will include a Congress Mass, keynote speakers and a drama highlighting the beauty of reverence and devotion. The day will conclude with Adoration.
