Donations and Gift Aid

If you are a taxpayer, you can increase your donations to Sacred Heart by 25%, simply by completing a Gift Aid Declaration (GAD). You only need to do this once.

Through the Gift Aid scheme, the government gives the church 25p for every £1 you donate. What the church receives is tax you have already paid. **It costs you no more.** To be able to claim that 25p for every £1 you donate, the church needs to keep a record of how much is donated by each Gift Aider. All tax payers are encouraged to make their donations under gift aid and the information you provide is in the strictest confidence. There are a few options available to make your donations under gift aid.

Single Donations under Gift Aid

If you wish to make a single gift aided donation by cash or cheque, please use the envelopes available at the back of church for single donations. Alternatively, if you wish to make a single gift aided donation by debit or credit card please use the Tap to Donate tablet at the back of church and choose to gift aid your donation. This method may also be used for regular donations by using the tablet each time you wish to donate.

Regular Donations under Gift Aid

If you wish to make regular gift aided donations (e.g. weekly or monthly) by standing order, cheque or offertory envelope please complete a Gift Aid Declaration (GAD) form which is available at the back of church.

Please note that you may choose the following donation options on the form:

- a) "past 4 years", which enables the parish to claim for previous as well as future donations;
- b) "future donations", which enables the parish to claim for future donations. Please do not select "today" since this is for one-off donations rather than regular donations.

You may also choose to make your donations by:

- a) Standing order - this is the preferred option since your donation is transferred directly from your bank account to the parish bank account.
- b) Cheque
- c) NE (offertory envelope)

Please ensure the form is signed and dated and hand your completed GAD to Fr. Michael or leave it at the presbytery.

Once you have completed your form, if you selected to pay by standing order, please set up a standing order with your bank for the regular amount you wish to donate. This can usually be done via online banking or via a banking app or by visiting your bank.

A message from The Children's Liturgy Team

Dear Families

As in previous years the Family Christmas Eve service will be taking place on 24th December at 4:00pm, with Carols from 3:45pm. We would like to ask the children of the parish to take the

important role of telling the Christmas story. We are looking for readers, greeters, singers and actors and there is space for everyone to get involved.

If your child would like to get involved you will need to arrive at church at 3:30pm to collect a costume (if required) have a quick run through so everyone knows what they need to be. Please email Liz (Children's liturgist) by Friday 20th December at: liz.yoxall@gmail.com. Please state what part they would like to play or if they are open, please just state ANY, children taking part in other roles may also be part of the children's choir throughout the rest of mass or volunteer for the offertory or greeting roles. We will let you know by email what part your child has been allocated. Please note the suggested age range for some of these parts when volunteering. If more than one child volunteers for each part, we will draw names from a hat and allocate the part at random from the volunteers. If your child does not want to take an active role, they are still welcome to come to church dressed as angels and shepherds and participate from their seats.

Readers - Age 8 and up

Children's Choir - Age 8 and up - must be able to sit well with the adult choir and parent must be seated close by.

Greeters - Any age - Help our adult greeters welcome and hand out orders of service.

Offertory procession - Age 8 up

Children Age 6 and up - Mary, Joseph, Angel Gabriel, Inn Keeper, Sheep, Donkey.

All age groups - Angels, Shepherds.

We ask that parents and carers use common sense when involving younger children, any age is welcome, as long as they can follow instructions on where to stand we would love to have them involved, alternatively why not ask an older sibling to volunteer with them to help guide them to their place.

The recent vote on the Terminally ill (End of Life) Bill

"Parliament recently voted on the Terminally Ill (End of Life) Bill which will proceed to the next stage. The Bill will face much more scrutiny at its next stage. There will be future opportunities to campaign against it. 275 MPs voted against it and many of those voting in favour said that they have reservations and may not support it in future unless changes are made. As the Bill passes through Parliament we can continue to act. We can continue to advocate and pray for the sanctity of life, the protection of vulnerable people from the risk of coercion to end their life or from being made to feel a burden and for more funding and access to end of life care.

Jubilee 2025 - Pilgrims of Hope

The Holy Father has announced that 2025 will be a Jubilee Year, something which happens every 25 years. The theme for Jubilee 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope," and it will be a year of hope.

Please pick up your Pilgrim Passport from the Church, which details designated pilgrimage places and all the events taking place across the diocese throughout 2025. The Jubilee banner displayed in Church shows the icon CAFOD commissioned from Ethiopia for the Jubilee Year, unveiled and blessed at Adoremus on 14 September, reminding us the Jubilee is a global event.

Deacon Tony is going on pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee, in February, to walk through the Holy Doors at St. Peter's Basilica, and will take particular prayer requests with him from the parish.

Jubilee Year Pilgrimage in Kent 15th - 19th September 2025

Pilgrimages have been organised by St Mary's Penistone, Sheffield over many years and the next is a five day stay in Kent with visits to the different National Shrines of St Jude and St Augustine.

There will be Masses at each Shrine with Fr Henry [St Mary's] celebrating. There will also be a tour of Canterbury Cathedral. A full free day is also included.

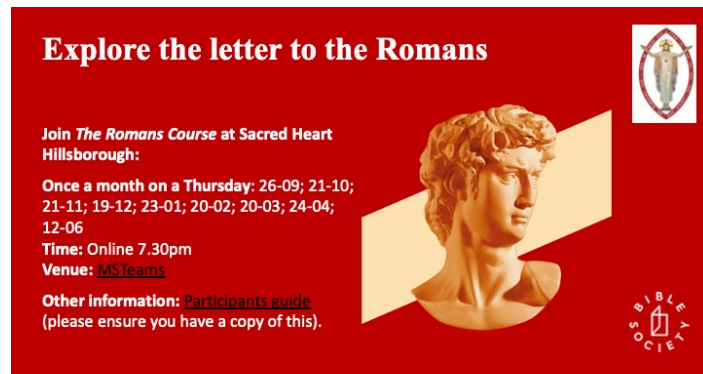
