Donations and Gift Aid

If you are a taxpayer, you can increase your donations to Sacred Heart by 25%, simply by completing a Gift Aid Declaration (GAD). You only need to do this once.

Through the Gift Aid scheme, the government gives the church 25p for every £1 you donate. What the church receives is tax you have already paid. **It costs you no more.** To be able to claim that 25p for every £1 you donate, the church needs to keep a record of how much is donated by each Gift Aider. All tax payers are encouraged to make their donations under gift aid and the information you provide is in the strictest confidence. There are a few options available to make your donations under gift aid.

Single Donations under Gift Aid

If you wish to make a single gift aided donation by cash or cheque, please use the envelopes available at the back of church for single donations. Alternatively, if you wish to make a single gift aided donation by debit or credit card please use the Tap to Donate tablet at the back of church and choose to gift aid your donation. This method may also be used for regular donations by using the tablet each time you wish to donate.

Regular Donations under Gift Aid

If you wish to make regular gift aided donations (e.g. weekly or monthly) by standing order, cheque or offertory envelope please complete a Gift Aid Declaration (GAD) form which is available at the back of church.

Please note that you may choose the following donation options on the form:

- a) "past 4 years", which enables the parish to claim for previous as well as future donations;
- b) "future donations", which enables the parish to claim for future donations. Please do not select "today" since this is for one-off donations rather than regular donations.

You may also choose to make your donations by:

- a) Standing order - this is the preferred option since your donation is transferred directly from your bank account to the parish bank account.
- b) Cheque
- c) NE (offertory envelope)

Please ensure the form is signed and dated and hand your completed GAD to Fr. Michael or leave it at the presbytery.

Once you have completed your form, if you selected to pay by standing order, please set up a standing order with your bank for the regular amount you wish to donate. This can usually be done via online banking or via a banking app or by visiting your bank.

Attention to new Readers of the Word of God

If you missed the November training for existing Readers or you are a new Reader then you are invited to a training session for new readers in the Church on Saturday 1st March from 10.00 until 12.00 noon. This will include an introduction to the Liturgy of the Word at Mass, the practical skills required for reading in church, use of the sound system, and an introduction to the new Lectionary and Bible translation. This will equip parish readers to more effectively proclaim the texts they read. If you love the Word of God and are confident in reading aloud in public then come along, undertake a short training session, and add your name to the roster for the Masses you normally attend.



Quarterly Memorial Mass Monday 10th March

At the last Memorial Mass in November, we prayed for the Holy Souls whose anniversaries occurred between November and January. The next memorial mass will be held on Monday the 10th of March. We will pray for the people in our remembrance books whose anniversaries occur between the 1st February and 30th April, any that were requested in the November Dead List Envelopes and all those whose remains are interred in our Memorial Garden. As usual there will be lists of names on the noticeboard at the mass, the names will be taken from our new remembrance book so if you need to transfer any names from the old book or add new names please could you do this as soon as possible. The old remembrance book will also be on display. This is a special way for us to remember and honour our loved ones.

Assisted Suicide Bill

On Friday 29 November of last year MPs narrowly voted to support Kim Leadbeater's dangerous assisted suicide Bill at its 2nd Reading. There are concerns about how the proposed law may endanger vulnerable, frail, elderly, disabled and terminally ill people, especially with pressures on the health service and adult social care. The principles also do not respect the sanctity of life, which recognises life as a gift from God. The Bill also fails to support more ethical alternatives like palliative care which is chronically underfunded. But this is only the first step - there's still time to stop it in its process through Parliament.

An analysis published in The Independent shows that at least 36 MPs who supported the Bill made it clear they did so only to allow further debate, or they had concerns that mean they won't commit to supporting the Bill at Third Reading. With the vote passing by a margin of 55, just 28 MPs switching their stance to oppose the Bill would ensure it's defeated at Third Reading. With more awareness of the serious risks, many MPs could change their position. If enough do, we can defeat this Bill at its 3rd Reading and stop it from becoming law.

Assisted suicide committee bias

Committee stage of Kim Leadbeater's assisted suicide Bill has begun, raising serious concerns about its conduct.

- The Committee has been 'stacked' with a higher number of MPs who support the Bill
- Nearly twice as many witnesses supported assisted suicide than the number who opposed it
- Important voices have been excluded, including the Government's chief Suicide Prevention Strategy Advisor, the British Geriatrics Society and a number of disability rights groups, senior palliative care doctors and legal experts with relevant expertise.

MPs must be aware of the serious issues in the scrutiny of Kim Leadbeater's Bill. It's vital they know your concerns and vote against it at Third Reading.

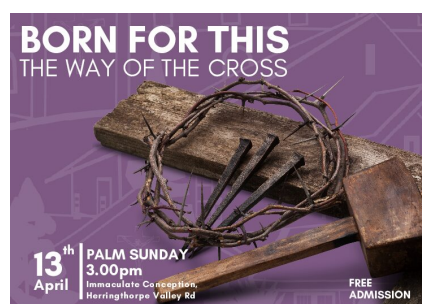

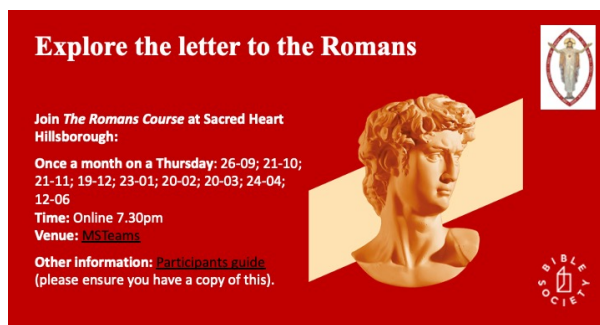
